Do You Serve God or Yourself?

Today's Christian is too concerned with the never ending quest of being entertained. They will focus their time and attention following these pursuits; while attending churches that play to these desires and ideas, for their own sake. They take no pleasure in the study of biblical history, teachings or spiritual concepts and therefore have no true knowledge of the true meaning of being a servant of Christ.

With their five senses they engage this world as if their physical existence is all that matters forgetting that *it is but a vapor* (James 4:14)

The world of sense intrudes upon our attention day and night for the whole of our lifetime. It is clamorous, insistent and self-demonstrating.
